
Principal's Message



The 60 minute multiple-choice paper is designed so that at least some questions are accessible to all but also to stretch our most able and enthusiastic mathematicians.

Refreshments will be available and there will be also be a bar.




Rawthorpe Boxing Club

Kirklees Annual Athletics Competition 2019

This year All Saints Catholic College competed in the annual Kirklees Athletics competition at the Spenborough athletics track. This events hosts over 20 schools from the Kirklees borough with students competing against each other in track and field events.

Myself and Mrs MacIntyre took 14 students, a boys team and a girls team, chosen from all year groups over the month of June 2019. Students were selected on their practical ability and attitude to learning in PE and around school.

We had some great successes over the meets with some students winning their event overall.

2nd place finish overall for the year 8 girls. Well done!

2nd place overall discus for Macey throwing 15.29m. Fantastic effort!

3rd place finish overall for the year 8 boys. Well done!

2nd place overall 100m race finishing with a time of 13.10s for Elijah. Great athleticism!

4th place finish overall for the year 7 boys - just missing out on 3rd place by 3 points so close. Great attitude and effort for this team of boys, who experienced the athletics event for the first time.

2nd place overall high jump for Frank jumping 1.18m. An excellent achievement for Frank as this was the first time he had ever done the high jump.

Year 7 girls finished 11th place overall out of 25 schools just missing out on a top 10 finish.

1st place 800m for Catherine such a talented young lady winning her event overall with a time of 6.21 minutes. Great hopes for Catherine in year 8 at athletics, hopefully she can retain her 1st place title representing team All Saints.

Year 9 girls finished 7th place overall. Well done! Great effort and athleticism on the day by all involved.

2nd place javelin overall for Florence throwing an amazing 17.84m - Florence is a regular attender of the athletics after school and did fantastic in her event. Hopefully in year 10 she can repeat her performance. Well done!

Year 9 boys finished 9th place overall. Well done!

3rd place overall 100m for Harrison with a time of 12.30s. This event was highly competitive with some quick heats. Well done Harrison!

Year 10 boys and girls finished 9th place overall in the competition. Well done!

1st place overall 1,500m for James who achieved his personal best in the event with a time of 2.16 minutes, a talented runner who experienced his last Spenborough event for All Saints. All the best for your athletics future James.

3rd place overall javelin for James throwing 24.81m - such a great young talent show casing his skills not only on the track but also the field. Well done!

After school sports

All Saints continues to represent in the local schools leagues and cups in a range of different sports. These include; football, girls football, netball, basketball, handball, athletics, futsal, indoor football, cricket, rounders and indoor athletics. There are also gymnastics, badminton, and rugby clubs after school which we are hoping to develop into competitive teams soon.

Team successes include the under 13 girls football team who were knocked out in the semi-finals of the English School cup, (9-a-side) national competition. 404 teams entered and they got through to the last 4. In the under 13 girls futsal 5-a-side National Cup, the girls went through to the final in May at St George's Park.

Basketball has also seen some great success again this year. Both the under 12 and under 16 teams are now Kirklees champions. With the teams competing in the West Yorkshire stage of the competition too but not progressing any further.

The under 15s cricket team are on course to be Huddersfield school division 2 champions. They are currently undefeated with 1 game still to play.

The under 13s and 15s boys football teams had successful seasons by both finishing joint top of their leagues but narrowly missing out on the titles on goal difference.

Handball has continued to grow in popularity with the club itself having over 50 regular participants. There are no official leagues for them to complete in yet but all teams were undefeated in the friendly fixtures that took place.

All Saints has been accepted onto the RFU's All Schools programme. Next year we will become a focus school for rugby union and with the help of coaches, club links and funding from the RFU will become a school delivering rugby union and feeding to the local YMCA club.

The ski trip has been announced to years 7 and 8, and 46 students will be going to Italy in 2020. The trip will be going in the 2nd week of the Easter holidays (13th April) to Santa Caterina in Northern Italy.
