The Holy Trinity

This week I found myself telling my daughter to 'count her blessings' as she has become increasingly sad at bedtime, when the day has ended and she is alone with her thoughts. I was surprised to find that I hadn't shared this with her before as it's something that I feel I have always done. So together we talked about what we had done that day, what we enjoyed, what made us smile and what we could plan for the next day.

Trinity Sunday gives us the opportunity to remember the triple blessing of the Lord and to consider this difficult concept. With apologies to Fr Elliott and his excellent CCRS theology teaching I quite like a pudding analogy. Consider chocolate three ways - you may have ordered this in a restaurant - it is essentially one pudding made up of three small individual portions (chocolate fudge cake, chocolate mousse and chocolate cheesecake or if you prefer lemon meringue, lemon fool and lemon drizzle cake) It counts as one dessert, served on the same rectangular slate but has three distinct elements.

In the same way the Holy Trinity is one but in three distinct parts - the Father, creator, who offers the covenant, the Son who offers salvation and the Holy Spirit who offers communion with the Lord.

So as we count our blessings, I shall finish with these two thoughts:

Remember that chocolate three ways is in essence one pudding and therefore not gluttony.

And each time we count our blessings in prayer we start with the reminder of the trifold blessing in the sign of the cross before we have even paused to think of what we have to be thankful for.

At the end of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus gives his disciples their marching orders, saying, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..."

There it is, God in all three persons. God beside us, before us, around us, with us, in heaven and on earth and anyplace we happen to go.

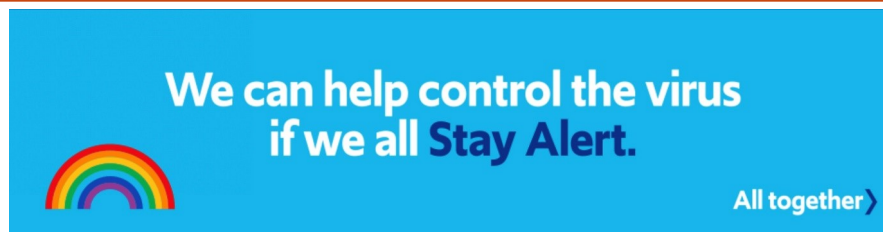

The Duke of Edinburgh Award - some updates

The **2020 DofE Certificate of Achievement** is being launched to formally recognise the accomplishments of participants who have completed their Volunteering, Physical and Skills sections despite the outbreak - but aren't able to do their expedition and achieve their Award right now. This will be awarded to any young person who started their programme from summer 2019 onwards who has completed the **Skills, Physical and Volunteering** sections of their Award and had them approved by their Leader by the end December 2020.

Certificates will be processed automatically by DofE via eDofE and sent to the participant's address as on their account.

Certificates are free and will be sent free of charge.

Section Evidence:

There is some flexibility at this time around activities from home and other cases that would not normally be allowed for the Award. Parents are still not allowed to be assessors (but school staff approve regularly on eDofE). They can upload evidence to say what participants have been doing from home but the DofE are requesting that if no one else is available to do a report, the award leaders write a report about the updates and evidence given as to what they have achieved within that section.

Participants are able to change activities more than once, this can be done on eDofE. However, participants are still required to fulfil the time requirements of the level of award. Minimum one hour a week over so many months.

Participants are also being advised to use the DofE app on smartphones as this is the easiest and quickest way to upload evidence.

Expedition:

At this time no expeditions can take place.

All Saints DofE team are currently in communication with Kirklees DofE to plan expeditions for next year. These are subject to government guidance on lockdown.

Social distancing measures need to be followed if they are still being applied, and decisions must be taken on whether this is practical on expedition.

We must follow all best practice guidelines, and to meet this:

- The Government must have lifted the lockdown on people visiting the countryside
- Educational Settings (Schools/Colleges) must be back
- Education visits must be permitted
- Campsites must have reopened
- Social distancing rules must not pose a barrier to the expedition

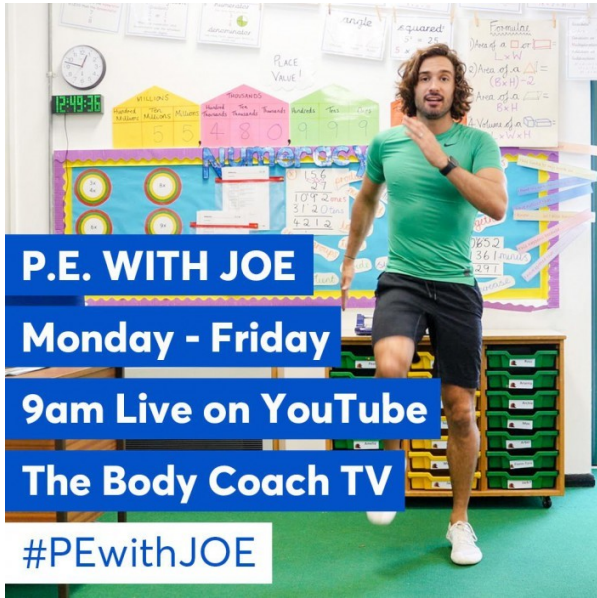


We can help control the virus if we all **STAY ALERT**
