Corpus Christi

Listening to the radio the other day I heard a dedication request for a boy of eleven who had completed a triathlon to raise money for an amputee charity because twelve months previously he had had his leg removed. Despite his own suffering he was willing to push himself to the limits in the service of others. This very physical endurance feat by such a young boy who had been through so much brings to mind the suffering for the sake of others that we are asked to remember in the sacrament of the Blessed Eucharist every week at Mass and especially on the Feast of Corpus Christi. We are taken back to the table of the last supper as the priest raises the host saying: "Take this all of you and eat of it for this is my body". In accepting the sacrament, we are inviting Jesus into our very being and acknowledging his sacrifice for us.

Last year on the Feast of Corpus Christi Pope Francis encouraged us to think of how love has great power:

The Eucharist, he said, is an example of doing big things with little, "for there we find God himself contained in a piece of bread. Being simple and essential, bread broken and shared, the Eucharist we receive allows us to see things as God does."

"It inspires us to give ourselves to others," he said, calling it "the antidote to the mindset that says:

'Sorry, that is not my problem,' or 'I have no time, I can't help you, it's none of my business.'

This year we have many opportunities to see the many acts of service and kindness that have been undertaken in the current circumstances, often with little resources yet achieving great things. This feast day also allows us pause to examine how we might be equally inspired in the service of others.

Some people, particularly children, receive their first Communion during Corpus Christi. This practice, also known as the Eucharist, involves people accepting consecrated bread and wine (or grape juice), which represent Jesus Christ's body and blood.

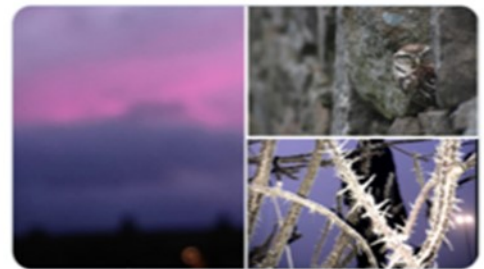

STEM Clubs Week

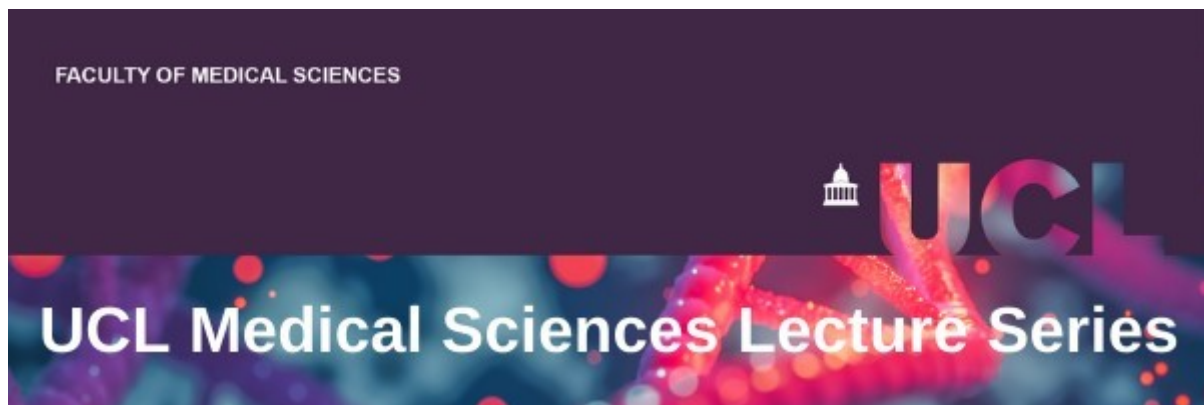
STEM Clubs Week is 22 – 26 June and the theme is sustainability.
