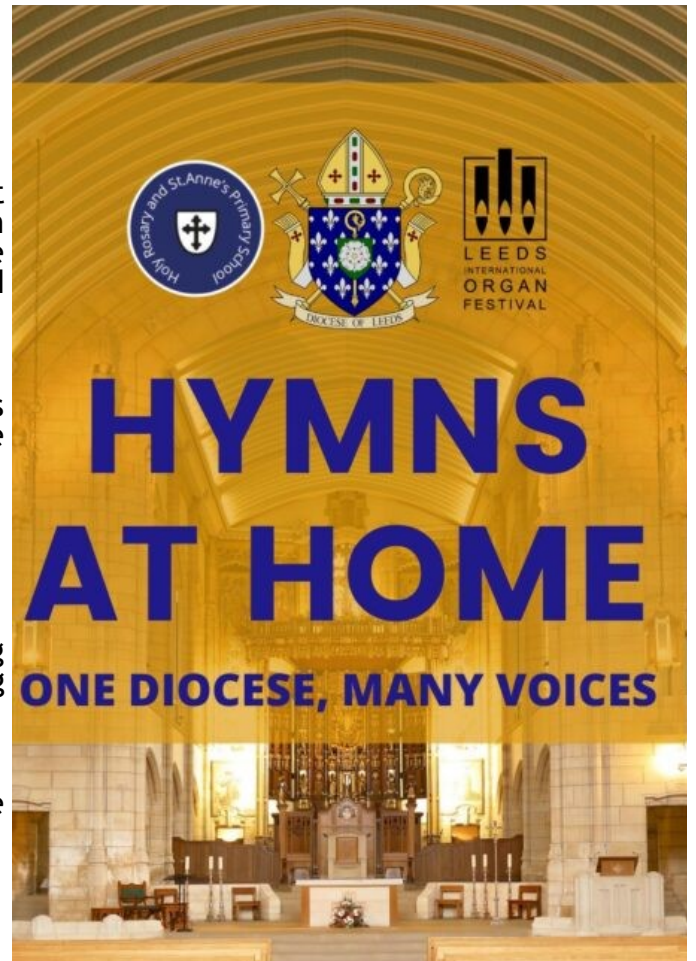
We are very pleased that Grace in Year 11 was involved in this and recorded herself singing at home to be part of a virtual choir. Well done Grace!

A message from the Achievement Coordinators

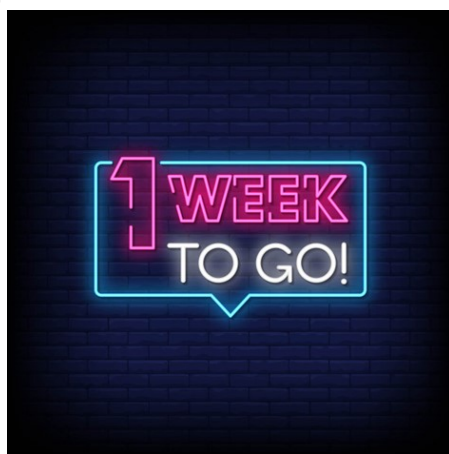

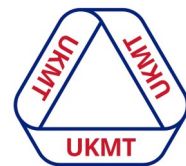
