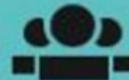

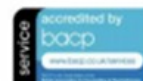

Get help with food, advice and support



We know that asking for help from a food bank can feel scary and is usually a last resort, but The Welcome Centre is here to help

If you're struggling financially we can help with weekly food and toiletry packs whilst you get back on your feet. We can help at any time, it doesn't matter if it's the school holidays or term time, and we can help anyone who is struggling, it doesn't matter if you receive free school meals or not.

The Welcome Centre Food Bank and More is an independent charity that can help anyone in Huddersfield and the surrounding areas. We can supply food, toiletries and household cleaning items. If you're struggling to afford to buy the food you need, please contact someone who can support you, for example your GP, teacher, health visitor, housing worker, or counsellor, who will offer help and make a referral to The Welcome Centre for you.

Welcome Centre Food Bank help - not just during school holidays



Family Help.

We appreciate that some families are struggling financially, even with the free school meal help that is available from school but we are here to help. We know that using a foodbank is often a last resort and that for many there is a stigma but we can make it as easy as possible, with food being delivered to your home address, so you don't need to come into the food bank

How can The Welcome Centre help?

We can offer help and support for families for as long as it is needed. Referring a family for food is easy and confidential.

How to get a referral:

Any professional that knows your family's situation can phone the dedicated telephone line 01484 340034. You can call **Kirklees Council's Local Welfare** line, 01484 414 782 which is open Monday to Friday 10am to 4pm to get a referral. You cannot self refer.

Our referral line 01484 340034 is open Monday to Friday 10am to 4pm. At present we are delivering food directly to the client address, the next working day after the referral is made. All drivers are DBS checked and will deliver adhering to government guidelines.

What we can offer:

As a food bank we obviously offer food but we can supply more than just food! We can supply any of the following:

- Food parcels (to suit available cooking facilities and dietary requirements)
- Toiletry packs (soap, toilet rolls, toothbrush & toothpaste, razors, deodorant & shaving foam and sanitary items)
- Cleaning Pack (Washing up liquid, dish cloth, sponge and J-Cloths)
- Towels Pack (bath, hand and flannel)
- Pair of Curtains (limited sizes available)
- Duvet Quilt (new or clean and washed)
- Bedding Pack (Duvet cover and sheet + pillowcases)
- Pillow (1 for single, 2 for double bed)
- PAT tested kettle and Toaster (if available)
- Home Starter Pack (Crockery, cutlery and pans, can opener, sharp knife, tea towels, laundry powder)

How often can we help?

As an independent charity we can be flexible and offer open ended support to help you get back on your feet. Most people only need one or two food parcels, but for those that need more we can also offer advice and guidance to try and resolve the financial crisis you are facing.

Uniform Exchange User Guide

Who are we?

In 2010, the Councils school uniform grant was cut in Kirklees and no provisions were put in place to help struggling families. In June 2011, the Uniform Exchange initiative was born.

Our mission is to provide free school uniform to any child who needs extra support and to encourage children and families to think of others and the environment. Instead of throwing away out-grown school uniform and filling the landfill sites, we are asking families to donate their uniform to us. We want to make school uniform accessible to all children across our area of Kirklees, especially those who find themselves struggling financially; helping to reduce social isolation and allowing children to be ready for learning.

What do we offer?

We offer an accessible free school uniform service, for primary and secondary school, where all items provided are recycled and mostly second-hand. We try to provide the full spectrum of items a child would need for school. The service is FREE to all. There may be limited items with logos on.

All the uniform is in very good condition depending on the value of the item. If it's a logo high school blazer we would let a few bobbles or repair a small hole in order for it to be used again. However a plain polo shirt it would be in very good condition.

How can you access the service?

This is hopefully a very simple and straight forward process. The form can be completed by a school, child's support team, charity, library or the family.

STEP 1

- Complete the basic one page form, the more information filled in the quicker the delivery. One form per child.
- The form can either be completed online or on a hard copy and scanned.
- If adding in parent details for collection purposes please make sure they know you have included it on the form.

STEP 2

- The form is then ideally emailed to info@uniform-exchange.org or posted to us depending on the speed you require it.
- Our email system is secure, and meets GDPR regulations. You should ideally be sending it from an encrypted email address.

STEP 3

- We will complete the order; then email you or contact the person on the form, when we have delivered the uniform to your requested drop off point.
- We drop off at schools, library's, community hubs, charity's, children's centres and work offices.
 - Although library's and some community centres are currently closed.
- This should take approx. 7 days however this does vary at certain times of the year.

We hope this is a simple process you can utilise on a regular basis.
