
The Examen encourages introspection, relaxation and hope.

# Black History Month

The theme for Black History Month 2021 is 'proud to be.' Students have been studying migration to Britain and exploring the mixed heritage of the nation in order to



gain an understanding of the longevity of migration and how richly diverse Britain is.

Students have focused on migration since the Roman period, through the Middle Ages and Early Modern Period up to Britain's Empire. Students have been able to gain an understanding of how countries are connected and the reasons why people migrated to Britain. Students were also able to assess the effect of migration - both positive and negative - and evaluate the impact of the empire.


Students were able to demonstrate the different ways in which Britain is diverse and multicultural and students were able to verbalise the development of attitudes towards migration throughout the years.

She has organized around the issues of health, student services and rights, rights for domestic workers, ending police brutality, anti-racism, and violence against transgender and gender non-conforming people of colour. # Free School Meal Voucher

October Half Term



Following the Government's announcement of the Household Support Fund, Kirklees has decided to use some of that funding to provide vouchers during the October half term.

Each child that is entitled to a Means-Tested Free School Meal, as assessed and notified by the appropriate authority, will be entitled to a £25 voucher. This time, the voucher is made up of £15 for food and £10 for fuel in recognition that all households are experiencing increased fuel costs. It is for the parent themselves to decide how to redeem the voucher and budget accordingly.

We therefore have sent households who meet the criteria a £25 voucher per eligible student via our preferred supplier Wonde, which is available to download from Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October.





#### Potential distruption to services

You will no doubt have seen numerous news articles about the shortage of drivers across the UK which also impacts on a shortage of bus drivers. Unfortunately, bus operators no longer have the usual number of spare drivers and are unable to deal with 'last minute' absence issues in the way they did previously.

# School Transport

What this means for school buses is that there will be occasions when one of the following scenarios will apply:

- Journeys will be doubled up i.e. one service will have to operate after another and the second one will be significantly late.
- Journeys will be combined. Buses will be much fuller and journey lengths may be longer.
- Journeys will be cancelled. Children will have to use public transport or be reliant on their parents to take them to school.

Whilst these unforeseen situations will be unavoidable, we wish to share these difficulties with parents and students so parents have a contingency plan in the event of service failure.

We encourage parents and students to follow Metro on Twitter '@metrogenm' where they will publish up-to-the minute information on service disruption. They will also be asking operators to publish information as soon as they are aware of a problem and to tag the aforementioned Twitter feed and the school's feed.

Metro assure the school they are working hard to minimise the disruption, but they thought it fair to make schools and families aware of this situation so that schools and families are prepared.
