**This Lent we are inviting schools to *Walk Against Hunger* in solidarity with the 200 million children whose lives are at risk because of malnutrition.**

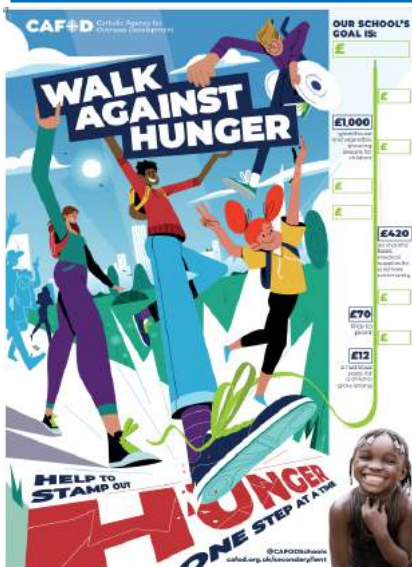
**All Saints striding out to make a difference this Lent**

### Ash Wednesday marks the start of the solemn season of Lent

Lent is the six weeks of preparation for Easter when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Ash Wednesday is a day when we begin our 'desert' experience. A journey with Christ through the silence of the desert. The desert is a place full of sand where there is no life. The desert is a hot place where death can arrive quickly. Christ entered this desert for forty days and nights because this time away from everybody and everything was important for him. During Lent we remember that time Christ spent in the desert, we enter into our own desert, making space and time to reflect on what is important to us, trying to avoid all the distractions that lead us away from God.

In school the Ashes service marks the start of Lent and our spiritual preparations for Easter. We enter into the season of Lent with the intention of praying more, fasting or giving up something to help us focus more on God and giving to others. There will be opportunity for reconciliation and to pray the Stations of the Cross.

### Promoting a love of problem solving

The Intermediate Mathematical Challenge is a 60-minute, multiple-choice competition aimed at students across the UK.

It encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems.

The problems on the Intermediate Mathematical Challenge are designed to make students think. Most are accessible, yet still challenge those with more experience.

This year we have 40 Year 9 and Year 10 pupils taking part in the online competition.

## Huddersfield Town Foundation Inclusive Sports Sessions

January 2022 has seen the Huddersfield Town Foundation launch a new programme of free weekly sport for young people with a disability and/or special educational needs!

The programme aims to give children aged 8-18 a safe space to try new sports and meet new people, to the benefit of their mental and physical health.

As such, participants will be given the opportunity to influence the sports they wish to play and shape the sessions to their needs.

The programme will initially run for 39 weeks and is funded by Kirklees Council's Children with a Disability Service through their Fun, Friendly and Fantastic Children with a Disability Fund.

Educational workshops on key life skills like first aid and resilience will also be delivered from time to time.

Participants will be able to benefit from Huddersfield Town matchday tickets and may even get the opportunity to experience matchday hospitality on occasion.

A group of participants were invited into a box when Town faced Coventry City in the Sky Bet Championship recently.

Sessions will take place every Tuesday at Huddersfield Leisure Centre, HD1 4BP, 6pm - 7pm and started Tuesday 18 January.

They will also run every Wednesday at Dewsbury Sports Centre, WF12 8EN, 5pm - 6pm and started Wednesday 19 January.

Both sessions will take place during school term time. During half terms at February, Easter and May, participants are encouraged to attend the Foundation's complimentary inclusive offer at Leeds Road Sports Complex.

Young people are more than welcome to attend both sites, should they wish. Similarly, carers and/or support workers are also welcome.

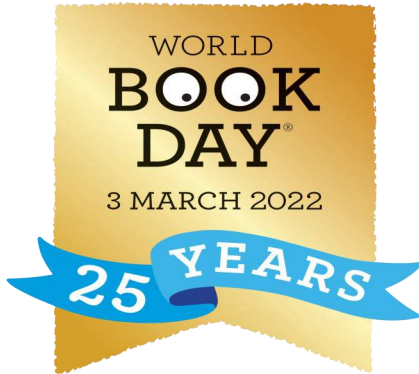

## Holiday Requests

### Leave of absence - Every school day matters

Many thanks for your support so far this term.

We would like to remind parents/carers that it is a legal responsibility to ensure that your child attends College, on time, each and every day it is open. All students should aim for 100% attendance, but should certainly achieve the College target of 96%.

To help further support your child's attendance we ask that all medical and dental appointments should be arranged outside of College time unless it is an emergency. Where appointments are to be taken during College time, evidence must be provided.

Please remember that you should not expect your child to be allowed leave of absence in term time. Parents do not have a legal right to take children out of school for holidays, as school terms are designed to offer opportunities for holidays to be taken throughout the academic year without disrupting the education of students. Leave of absence is something All Saints Catholic College strongly disapproves of during term time as it can have a serious detrimental impact on educational outcomes. Absence from school clearly correlates with lower attainment and progress, with every day missed possibly affecting the chance of strong educational outcomes.

If you need to take your child out of school during term time due to exceptional circumstances, please download a 'Leave of Absence Request Form' from the school's website. The Principal should receive the form at least 4 weeks in advance of the proposed date of travel.

Consistency is a key aspect of our School ethos to ensure all students achieve their very best. Therefore, can I please ask that you ensure your child has the correct uniform for the new half-term when they return on Monday 28th February.

We would like to remind you of some key parts of the Bfl policy, which can also be found on the School's website. The intention of this is to avoid unnecessary conversations and/or sanctions at the start of the new half-term should students return to school not dressed in accordance with school uniform policy:

**Trousers:** Wear black college tailored trousers. **Black jean type, skinny fit, tight trousers or leggings are not acceptable.**

**Shoes:** Wear plain black college type shoes. Sensible shoes remain essential for the safety of students and slip on 'ballet style' or 'holiday' footwear is not appropriate in College. **Fashion shoes, pumps, boots or trainers are not acceptable.**

**Trainers:** Trainers may be worn only in PE and Drama. Trainers are only allowed for short term problems and only when a doctor's note has been brought into the College. **Footwear which resembles trainers or pumps is not an acceptable substitute for shoes.**

**Outdoor Clothing:** Put coats, hats, scarves, gloves, etc. into lockers or college bags. These items will be confiscated if seen worn in College as will other non-uniform items such as cardigans. Wear an outdoor coat of a sensible style. **Coats cannot be worn indoors.**

Please do ensure that your child is in the correct uniform come Monday 28th February. Those students who are not will be given the appropriate sanction and parents contacted until the issue has been fully resolved. We would like to stress that any sanction issued is absolutely the last resort.

We are very proud of our School and of our students and believe that high standards of uniform, behaviour, being properly equipped and attending regularly give each and every one of our students the very best chance of learning well and achieving their very best.
