Free School Meals

One-off Summer Payment

It has now been confirmed that every child or young person who is eligible for free school meals will qualify for a $\pounds70$ one-off summer payment designed to support their family with the cost of living.

It is important to note this is not a 'free school meals payment' - it is financial support on a broader scale, reflecting the current challenges being faced by so many people.

The school provided you once again with a choice of a voucher from Wonde by email on Wednesday 20th July, and we are asking you to choose your preferred supermarket, as you did with free school meal vouchers in previous holiday periods.

College Uniform Update

Changes in line with the Governments' Education Act 2021

With effect from September 2022, please be aware there is no longer a requirement for badged All Saints uniform items to be worn by students, with the exception of the College blazer and tie.

Both the College blazer and tie are compulsory items.

All other uniform items, including those required for PE, can be purchased from any clothing retailer, as long as they meet the College requirements which are available on our website https:// www.aschc.com/college-uniform/. A reminder of some of our uniform guidelines can be found below:

Trousers: Leggings or skin tight jeans/trousers are unacceptable. Trousers should not cling around the thighs,







Shoes: These should be plain black college-type shoes. Sensible shoes remain essential for the safety of students and slip on 'ballet style' or 'holiday' footwear is not appropriate in College. Fashion shoes, pumps, boots or trainers are not acceptable. Shoes should be worn with black socks.





Hair: Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school. There are many fashions that come and go and these are monitored. Hair needs to be of an even length with no Mohican tops or shaved sides. There should be no tramlines or patterns cut into the hair either. Hair colour should be natural e.g., no pink or other extreme colours are allowed.





Make-up and Nails: Make-up should not be visible and students will be expected to remove any visible make-up once they are in College. It would be better for them not to apply such make-up in the first place. Nail varnish and false nails are not allowed in College.

Jewellery: Earrings, stretchers or any kind of piercings should not be worn for College. Some students have piercings in or around their earlobe. These must also be removed for College, as should nose piercings. Likewise, only one bracelet can be worn for religious observance. Jewellery will be confiscated if worn in College.

Geography - Year 10 Field Trip to Flamborough Head and Hornsea

Year 10 geographers enjoyed a trip to the fastest eroding coastline in Europe last week.

The main aim of the trip was to complete compulsory GCSE fieldwork at Flamborough Head and Hornsea.

At Flamborough Head students went on a coastal walk and spotted coastal landforms including; caves, arches, stacks and wave cut platforms at the chalk cliffs, as well as a whole host of seals basking in the sun.

They also sketched some of these landforms while enjoying an ice cream.

The main geography fieldwork took place at Hornsea, with students measuring groynes at different distances from the sea to evaluate the impact of longshore drift, and if they were effectively protecting the coast.

We also managed to enjoy some fish and chips whilst on the beach. Students behaviour was excellent, and they were great role models for the school.

Science - Big Bang Fair, 22nd June

On a bright sunny day in June, a coach full of Year 9 students made the long journey to the Birmingham NEC to attend this year's Big Bang Fair.

This is the United Kingdom's largest celebration of STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) for young people, and is one of the largest youth events in the UK.

Our students dived straight in and engaged in over 70 hands-on activities brought to them by many universities and companies, including Rolls Royce, Network rail, Birmingham City University and Leonardo UK LTD .

They also chatted to 'real life' scientists and engineers about what they do and how they get inspired.

History - Skipton Castle

On Friday 8th July, GCSE History students went on a day trip to explore Skipton Castle and the surrounding area. As part of their GCSE course, students study a local aspect of History and are examined on their knowledge of the site at the end of Year 11. The trip helped students to experience the different features of the castle and to see for themselves what the castle and surrounding area was like.

Students enjoyed a professionally-delivered guided tour of the castle and were able to ask any questions that they had. Students climbed the spiral castle steps (albeit very tentatively) to the tallest watchtower and ventured down beneath the castle into the cold, dark dungeons to gain a real sense of what it would have been like to live there both as a Lord and as a prisoner!

Students were able to clearly see the physical features of the castle from the Medieval Period up to modern day and were able to understand why the location of Skipton Castle was chosen and why the castle was built. Students were also taught about the ways in which society has changed over time and how historical buildings can evidence this - including how dogs were seen as higher in status than women!

All 85 students were extremely well behaved and represented the school with pride.

It was an incredibly valuable experience for students and we look forward to going again next year.

Maths

Providing an additional opportunity for problem solving

The Junior Kangaroo is a follow-on round to the <u>Junior Mathe-</u> <u>matical Challenge</u>. It is a 60-minute, multiple-choice Challenge consisting of 25 problems.

Several thousand UK-based students from the <u>Junior Mathematical Challenge</u> are invited to take part in the Junior Kangaroo. Entry to the Challenge is **by invitation only** and is based on a qualifying score, which is variable from year to year.

Awards

The **top-scoring 25%** of participants each receive a **Certificate of Merit**. Each participant below this threshold receives a Certificate of Qualification or Participation depending on their entry route.

Certificates are pre-populated with student names and can be downloaded and printed as soon as results are released.

The 2022 award thresholds were:

Merit: 97+

In College, we actively promote reading at home and would encourage parents/carers to keep students actively involved in reading during the summer holidays.



Everything changed when I saw him, a tall man around his mid-fifties, his white sleeveless shirt covered by bright yet somewhat dark blood smeared all over it, black trousers with the legs ripped apart, nothing but a numbly terrifying image before my eyes, the idea jumping with anxiety in my head of him at any point attacking me.

I see his fingers ticking as I anticipate his next movement. Nevertheless, his hands only move up him slowly, him finally placing them on his chest, grabbing tightly the fabric of his blood-soaked shirt. 'Sssteve', he says, stuttering in between his words. 'I I'm sorry for what I have done, not even God Almighty can forgive the sins against you, please have mercy on my soul'.

My body frozen, I want to scream my lungs out for help but his words had broken my thoughts briefly. His hand falls off, eye's wide open as he gave his last breath.

I always thought I wouldn't care when my life was over, but seeing my fate with my own eyes, my soul, my life, left me broken!

STUDENTS WITH HIGHER ATTENDANCE ACHIEVE BETTER QUALIFICATIONS

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope this letter finds you well and you are all looking forward to a well-deserved break over the summer holidays.

As you know, good attendance in school is key to securing good outcomes and students achieving their target grades. Research shows that attendance and punctuality are vitally important to success at school and that there is a direct correlation between attendance and progress and attainment in school. The attendance target at All Saints Catholic College is 96%. We want to work with families to ensure that all students achieve this target.

The College attendance target is based on the minimum level that further education colleges, apprenticeship providers and employers consider to be good attendance. 95% attendance means a student has missed 10 days of school in a year. This equates to 50 hours of lost learning which will have a massive impact on a student's ability to progress and succeed. Equally, if a student arrives 5 minutes late to school each day, they will miss 3 days of school in a year which equates to 15 hours of lost learning.

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact College before 8.30am on each and every day of absence. Absence should be reported in the following way:

Next academic year is an opportunity for all students to have a fresh start. We want to help ensure your child's attendance is above the target of 96%. The Attendance Team, your child's Achievement Coordinator and BfL Coordinator as well as the Learning Tutors are here to work with you and your child to ensure they achieve the best possible level of attendance.




<u>Year 10</u>



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
