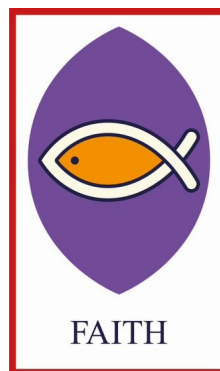

## Cost of Living

### One-off Cost of Living Payment

Kirklees Council have recently announced they will be providing financial support for the families of those children who are entitled to free school meals, to receive a one-off cost of living payment of £50 per child. This will help families who are experiencing extreme financial difficulties in Kirklees.

Families can expect to receive this money before Christmas, and Kirklees will confirm shortly how this will be distributed - more information is to follow.

The importance of problem-solving skills for future employment prospects can't be overstated.

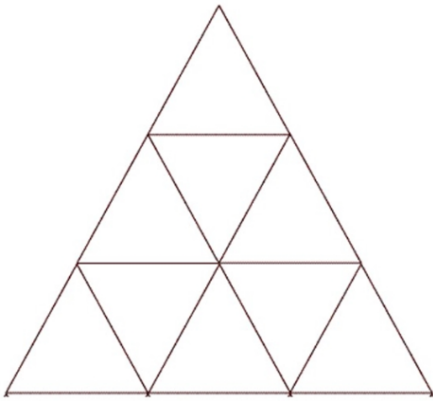

Last year, we introduced the National Tutoring Programme in maths to support some students who wanted to progress from the foundation to the higher tier exams.

The programme also allowed a number of students who had missed school due to COVID to catch up on missed work.

The students who engaged positively in this intervention programme performed well in their GCSEs and we have therefore decided to extend the programme.

The programme normally runs for a 15 week period, one hour per week. The sessions in maths are either before school (7:30 - 8:30am) or after other revision sessions (4:10 to 5:10pm).

We will be comparing the results of the 'most improved' winner to their baseline test scores recorded by your teacher to ensure everyone is playing at the highest levels of integrity!

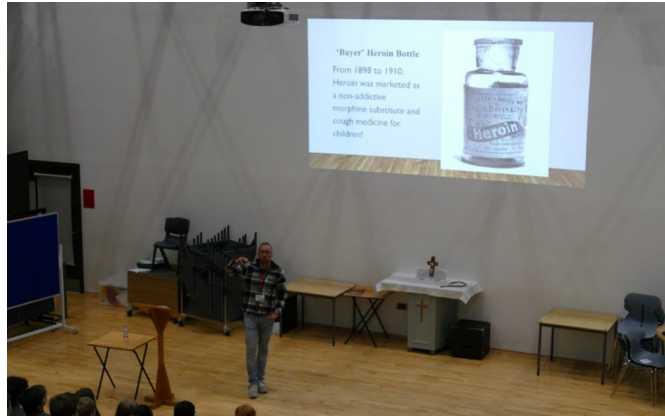

Andy visited All Saints this month and delivered his presentation 'The harmful effects of pornography' to Year 10.

Andy also spoke about other issues, including young people 'sexting', something which has become a massive issue across the country.

Andy used his own experience of being addicted to pornography, from first viewing it at the tender age of 11, explaining how it negatively affected his life and how he got eventually got free from the addiction.

Lee and Andy also spoke about other issues, including their own experience of alcohol addiction and the impact on their mental health.

Their personal accounts explained why they became addicted to alcohol, how this negatively affected their lives and how they eventually got free from alcohol addiction.

## Music

We start this academic year by congratulating last year's Year 11 for their great results in Music and also by welcoming Mrs Priestley who has joined Mrs Sidwell in the Music department.

This half-term, Year 7 have been learning about the elements of music, focussing on rhythm through learning to play Samba instruments. Year 8 have been learning about the English composer Gustav Holst and his 'Planet Suite' through working in groups to compose their own version. Year 9 have been learning about arrangements and have created their own version of Edvard Grieg's 'In The Hall of the Mountain King' on the keyboard.

Next half-term, Year 7 will be moving onto singing and learning to play the keyboard, Year 8 will be learning about computer game music and Year 9 will be learning about Musicals.

The Year 10s have settled in well to the GCSE Music course and the Year 11s are continuing to make good progress.

Our GCSE Music students in Year 10 and 11, as well as some members of our choir, have started a Song Writing project as part of Kirklees Year of Music 2022. This involved working with a professional song writer during a workshop this half term. In half-term 2, a small group of these students will be attending a 2-day song writing workshop hosted by Musica Kirklees, to compose a song alongside other secondary schools. The song will be recorded, and lyrics and sheet music will be sent out to schools across Kirklees for school bands and choirs to learn and then come together to form a massed Kirklees choir and band, to perform the song our students will have composed. This is a very exciting project to be involved in!

Individual instrumental/singing lessons have continued with Musica Kirklees and anyone who is interested in learning any instrument or having singing lessons can apply online at [Online Application Form - Musica Kirklees](#).

All students are welcome to attend co-curricular activities after school, these need to be booked on SchoolCloud. In Music we are currently offering:

Wednesday - All Saints Band

Thursday and Friday - GCSE practical and composition sessions.

We would recommend anyone considering taking GCSE Music, or anyone already on the course, to have instrumental/singing lessons and to attend the relevant co-curricular activity after school.

We also have students taking part in our steel pan group during school time who, this half-term, have made a recording for the Probation Services Members Black History Celebrations and have performed at Open Evening.

We are looking forward to next half-term which will see a return of music in Masses and to our annual Christmas Concert in December. We look forward to seeing you at the Christmas Concert supporting your child and other students. More information about the concert will be available in half-term 2.



## Modern Foreign Languages

### European Languages Day - 26.09.22

We celebrated European Languages Day this year by asking staff to try to say the title for their lesson in any foreign language.

It was remarkable to promote our subject area and to illustrate to students how important languages and resilience are to shape the students in our care.

Some staff invested time asking how the words would be pronounced phonetically and took their registers in their chosen foreign language.

We also had flags displayed and had translated into Latin parts of our prayers used that morning. In assembly, students were drawn attention to the importance of language learning and giving things a go.

The MFL department chose to look at which countries students had visited and which cultures had shaped them as individuals. Students then tried to draw flags on a body to show how much that country had shaped them. It was interesting to see the diversity we have in our community at school and how it is shaping us, something that can only be celebrated, and will be beneficial for our future workforce.

We saw how “Learning a foreign language is easily done by anybody. So don’t worry if you think you don’t have an aptitude for language. Desire is all you need and the tools” as all our staff showed on that day.

Thanks go out to everyone involved, including students that made that day for our subject such a memorable one in 2022.

## School Transport

### Bus Services

Thank you for your patience during the review of the transport to school arrangements conducted by both West Yorkshire Combined Authority for our Kirklees families and

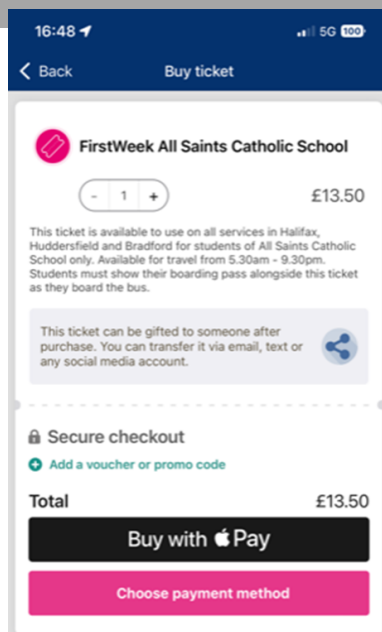
First Bus for our Calderdale families.

A polite reminder of the valid bus passes for the services are listed below. Please ensure you purchase the correct pass for the service your child uses as the Halifax service only accepts the First Bus pass.

**Huddersfield routes:** K60 / K65 / K66 / K67 / 360 accept Metro Card passes only.

**The Halifax C78 First Bus service only accepts First Bus travel bus pass for this service.** Students have the option of pay-as-you-go on a daily basis or alternatively you can purchase a bus pass online for a weekly cost of £13.50.

The weekly bus pass enables students to use the pass on any First Bus service 7 days per week. Any student without this pass will not be excluded from boarding the bus in the first instance, but they will be asked for their name and form tutor in school. Although, if this becomes a regular occurrence it could jeopardise the student’s travel arrangements.

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope this letter finds you well and you are all looking forward to a well-deserved break over the October holidays.

As you know, good attendance in school is key to securing good outcomes and students achieving their target grades. Research shows that attendance and punctuality are vitally important to success at school and that there is a direct correlation between attendance and progress and attainment in school. The attendance target at All Saints Catholic College is 96%. We want to work with families to ensure that all students achieve this target.

The College attendance target is based on the minimum level that further education colleges, apprenticeship providers and employers consider to be good attendance. 95% attendance means a student has missed 10 days of school in a year. This equates to 50 hours of lost learning which will have a massive impact on a student's ability to progress and succeed. Equally, if a student arrives 5 minutes late to school each day, they will miss 3 days of school in a year which equates to 15 hours of lost learning.

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact College before 8.30am on each and every day of absence. Absence should be reported in the following way:

We want to help ensure your child's attendance is above the target of 96%. The Attendance Team, your child's Achievement Coordinator and BfL Coordinator as well as the Learning Tutors are here to work with you and your child to ensure they achieve the best possible level of attendance.

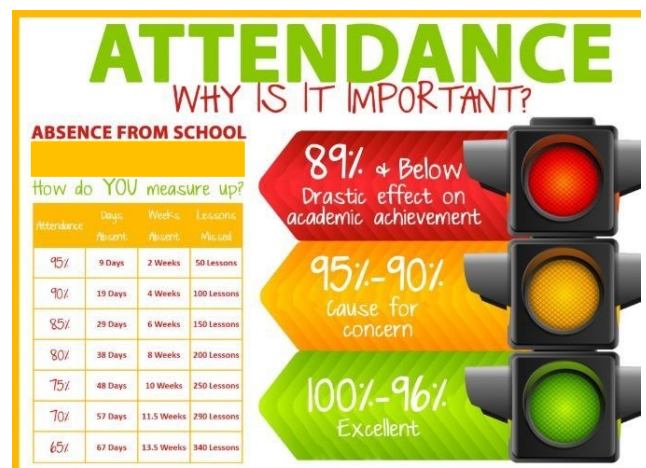

# College Uniform Update

Changes in line with the Governments' Education (Guidance about Costs of School Uniforms) Act 2021

With effect from September 2022, please be aware there is no longer a requirement for badged All Saints uniform items to be worn by students, **with the exception of the College blazer and tie.**

**Both the College blazer and tie are compulsory items.**

All other uniform items, including those required for PE, can be purchased from any clothing retailer, as long as they meet the College requirements which are available on our website <https://www.aschc.com/college-uniform/>.

A reminder of some of our uniform guidelines can be found below:

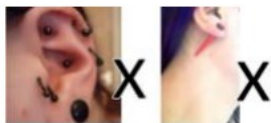
**Trousers:** Leggings or skin tight jeans/trousers are unacceptable. Trousers should not cling around the thighs, knees and calves. Trousers should be tailored fabric trousers.



**Shoes:** These should be plain black college-type shoes. Sensible shoes remain essential for the safety of students and slip on 'ballet style' or 'holiday' footwear is not appropriate in College. Fashion shoes, pumps, boots or trainers are not acceptable. Shoes should be worn with black socks.



**Hair:** Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school. There are many fashions that come and go and these are monitored. Hair needs to be of an even length with no Mohican tops or shaved sides. There should be no tramlines or patterns cut into the hair either. Hair colour should be natural e.g., no pink or other extreme colours are allowed.



**Make-up and Nails:** Make-up should not be visible and students will be expected to remove any visible make-up once they are in College. It would be better for them not to apply such make-up in the first place. Nail varnish and false nails are not allowed in College.

**Jewellery:** Earrings, stretchers or any kind of piercings should not be worn for College. Some students have piercings in or around their earlobe. These must also be removed for College, as should nose piercings. Likewise, only one bracelet can be worn for religious observance. Jewellery will be confiscated if worn in College.
