EduLink



Over the past few years, we have made use of a number of apps and platforms that have been introduced to support you in monitoring your child's progress, communicating with the school and, most recently, booking parents evenings and after-school activities. We have taken feedback from parents and conducted our own review of the services these apps and platforms provide, and we have chosen to introduce a more comprehensive app called **EduLink One**.

The transition to EduLink One has already begun in school. Initially, parents will be able to view their child's details, timetable, attendance, behaviour, achievement points and after-school activities.

All messages, notifications and emails will now be sent to parents through EduLink. Please ensure you turn on notifications for the app to ensure you do not miss any messages. Moving forwards, only urgent whole school messages will be sent by text, all other messages will be sent as push notifications through the app - these will appear as pop-ups on your device, or emails via EduLink. We will continue to use SchoolCloud for booking parents evenings for the remainder of this academic year, although from September 2023, parents evening bookings will also move to EduLink. Bookings for after-school activities are to be made using EduLink One within the "clubs" section.

The intention behind the move to this app is to make processes easier and more convenient for you, being able to access a multitude of information in one place. When EduLink One is fully established, the only other service parents will need to make use of is ParentPay.

EduLink One is free to access on any modern web-enabled device, either via www.edulinkone.com on a web browser on PCs, laptops, tablets and mobile devices or with the dedicated app on Android or iOS.

You are eligible to access EduLink One if you are a parent/carer with parental responsibility for a student at All Saints. If you have more than one child at the school, you will only require one account. You will need the following information to log in:

School ID: You can either use ASCC or HD22JT

Username: You have received an email with your username details.

Password: You can change your password once you have logged in. You can also ask to reset your password directly through EduLink.

Log in details have been sent to the email address you have already provided to school from edul-ink@aschc.com. Please check your junk mail if you have not received this.







Students must continue to attend Monday after-school sessions to plan for the qualifying expedition in May.




















Drop Down Day

First Aid Student Medication

As per our First Aid and Student Welfare Policy, which can be found on our website, medication cannot be held or taken in school unless it is prescribed by a GP to be taken 4 times a day, showing evidence of this on the label.

If medication is required to be taken 3 times per day, it needs to state the required timings of when to give the medication to the student on the label.

Medication cannot be administered to any student unless a Medical Care Plan has been filled in and signed by a parent/carer.

Certain adjustments can be made for students with an allergy or diabetic needs, for example.

Any medication, including paracetamol and Ibuprofen or any other over the counter medications will be confiscated if they are found on a child, and a parent will be contacted to arrange collection of the medication.

Please contact the Student Welfare Officer, Miss Holdsworth, by email to **firstaid@aschc.com**, if your child has been prescribed medication that needs to be kept in school.

Any medication that is currently held at school which does not follow the above procedures will be sent home in due course.

Medication will be held securely in the medical room.

Attendance reminder for 2022/2023

Attendance

Good attendance in school is key to securing good outcomes and students achieving their target grades. Research shows that attendance and punctuality are vitally important to success at school and that there is a direct correlation between attendance and progress and attainment in school.

The attendance target at All Saints Catholic College is **96**%. We want to work with families to ensure that all students achieve this target.

The table below clearly demonstrates that if your child's attendance is at or below 90% over the academic year then they will miss four weeks of school. If your child's attendance remains at or below 90% over five years then, accumulatively, they will miss over half a whole school year.

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact College before 8.30am on each and every day of absence.

Attendance is monitored daily and reviewed in full on a half-termly basis, with parents being notified of any concerns half-termly as a minimum.

We fully understand that young people will at times become unwell and will need to be absent from school, however, we feel that it is vital to encourage children to have resilience and be in school as much as physically possible. If your child is unwell at the start of the day, but starts to feel better later in the day, we encourage you to send them to school, even if this is just for the afternoon, as this will have a positive effect on their attendance.

Next term is an opportunity for all students to have a fresh start and we would want to help ensure your child's attendance is above the target of 96%.

The Attendance Team, your child's Achievement Coordinator and BfL Coordinator, as well as the Learning Tutors, are here to work with you and your child to ensure they achieve the best possible level of attendance.

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College Uniform Update

Changes in line with the Governments'
Education (Guidance about Costs of School Uniforms) Act 2021

With effect from September 2022, please be aware there is no longer a requirement for badged All Saints uniform items to be worn by students, with the exception of the College blazer and tie.

Both the College blazer and tie are compulsory items.

All other uniform items, including those required for PE, can be purchased from any clothing retailer, as long as they meet the College requirements which are available on our website https://www.aschc.com/college-uniform/.

A reminder of some of our uniform guidelines can be found below:

Trousers: Leggings or skin tight jeans/trousers are unacceptable. Trousers should not cling around the thighs, knees and calves. Trousers should be tailored fabric trousers.







Shoes: These should be plain black college-type shoes. Sensible shoes remain essential for the safety of students and slip on 'ballet style' or 'holiday' footwear is not appropriate in College. Fashion shoes, pumps, boots or trainers are not acceptable. Shoes should be worn with black socks.





Hair: Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school. There are many fashions that come and go and these are monitored. Hair needs to be of an even length with no Mohican tops or shaved sides. There should be no tramlines or patterns cut into the hair either. Hair colour should be natural e.g., no pink or other extreme colours are allowed.







Make-up and Nails: Make-up should not be visible and students will be expected to remove any visible make-up once they are in College. It would be better for them not to apply such make-up in the first place. Nail varnish and false nails are not allowed in College.

Jewellery: Earrings, stretchers or any kind of piercings should not be worn for College. Some students have piercings in or around their earlobe. These must also be removed for College, as should nose piercings. Likewise, only one bracelet can be worn for religious observance. Jewellery will be confiscated if worn in College.




