Behaviour

At All Saints, we focus on areas of behaviour which have an immediate impact on an individual's ability to access learning. The underlying philosophy of the All Saints approach to all students deserve the right to learn without anyone preventing

Behaviour for Learning (BfL) is that all students deserve the right to learn without anyone preventing them from doing so and that students will continue to grow to be loving, serving, faithful, respectful and courageous citizens.

The majority of our students do follow the college rules, and are praised for doing so. However, when the rules are not followed, students have to accept the consequences of their actions.

A big focus of establishing a calm and purposeful culture is ensuring consistency is implied across all areas and this is something that we will continue to strive to do, now and moving forward. You will be pleased to know that we are continuing to ensure we raise our expectations as we enter the final half -term of this academic year, in order to get the very best from your child and all those whom we serve.

Therefore, we would really appreciate your help in ensuring that, as a community, we continue to do this together:

- Download the Parent EduLink App to monitor your child's progress; to keep an eye on those areas that need improving and those areas that should be celebrated.
- Talk to your child about their school day; what went well and what did not go so well.
- Ensure your child arrives to college on time and that they are fully prepared for the school day.
- Ensure your child is dressed in full college uniform.
- Contact the College if you have any questions regarding homework, the wellbeing of your child or any other concern or question you may have.

Attendance reminder for 2022/2023

Attendance



Good attendance in school is key to securing good outcomes and students achieving their target grades. Research shows that absence from school clearly correlates with lower attainment and progress, with every day missed possibly affecting chances of strong educational outcomes.

The attendance target at All Saints Catholic College is **96%**. We want to work with families to ensure that all students achieve this target.

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact College before 8.30am on each and every day of absence.

Absence should be reported in the following way:

Telephone College on 01484 426466 and press Option 1 to report an absence

Attendance is monitored daily and reviewed in full on a half-termly basis, with parents being notified of any concerns on a half-termly basis as a minimum.

We would also like to stress that as a school we fully understand that young people unfortunately will, at times, become unwell and will need to be absent from school. However, we feel that it is vital to encourage children to have resilience and be in school as much as physically possible. If your child is unwell at the start of the day, but starts to feel better later in the day, send them to school, even if this is just for the afternoon, as this will have a positive effect on their attendance.

Next term is an opportunity for all students to have a fresh start and we would want to help ensure your child's attendance is above the target of 96%.

The Attendance Team, your child's Achievement Coordinator and BfL Coordinator, as well as the Learning Tutors, are here to work with you and your child to ensure they achieve the best possible level of attendance.

Please do not hesitate to contact College if you need any help or support in relation to your child's attendance.

Queries regarding attendance can be emailed directly to your Achievement Coordinator.

Further information regarding attendance can be found in our Attendance Policy which is available on the College website https://www.aschc.com/attendance/.

The table below clearly demonstrates that if your child's attendance is at or below 90% over the academic year then they will miss four weeks of school. If your child's attendance remains at or below 90% over five years then, accumulatively, they will miss over half of a school year.

Student Council members, who represent their year groups, attended a special recycling-themed meeting, attended by a Kirklees Council representative, to discuss the steps we are taking to become more eco-friendly.

It was noted in the meeting that the rubbish produced from single-use plastic bottles when littered has a negative effect on wildlife, particularly because these do not decompose.

We are currently implementing new recycling bins - student-designed posters will highlight the bins to our students.

Whilst we encourage students to continue putting their litter in the correct bins, we ask that they bring their own reusable bottles to school to reduce both the amount of rubbish and the risk to the environment.

It is estimated that around 16 million plastic bottles used in the UK every day end up in landfill, being burnt, or entering the environment and waterways.
