Hindsight is a wonderful thing - we know what has happened and can view a situation logically and with the confidence that we would make the right choice of action if we were in that situation again. There is the opportunity to make different choices, say the right thing and take a different path. We are all human and part of humanity is making mistakes and learning from them.

Jesus was born human but as the Son of God he could see the path before him. He knew what his walk through life would be like, his purpose on earth and how it would end. As a boy visiting the temple he talks of being in 'his Father's house', about the work he has been sent to do and he also indicates 'his time' when all will know who he is through the revelation of his salvific identity.

In riding through Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, he was acutely aware of his ultimate destination, he reveals that he will be betrayed by one of his own whilst at the table of the last supper - he knows it must be. However, Jesus' humanity is revealed in his prayer asking "My Father! If it is possible, let this cup pass from Me." He implores God for a different way, a way that doesn't include the suffering he must face in fulfilling his destiny.

As we contemplate our own lives and the people we have met along the way, hindsight may be leading us to contemplate those instances where we would have said or done something different. Even in the midst of Jesus' pain and anguish, his purpose of doing everything in love, of dying in place of our sins so that we might be saved, is underlined by the additional act of love in ensuring that his mother and faithful disciples are there for each other. As we stand before the cross this Easter, may we all look to the example of Jesus in living a life of love and see all those we encounter as members of our own family.

Once again, we had over 60 students and staff attending Exposition in the Chapel, an opportunity to spend time in silent prayer before Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance. This regular time in the Chapel is much appreciated in school and provides a peaceful, focused time of prayer. We have invited Fr John in to say the Benediction next time, which will be broadcast to the whole school to end this time of Adoration.

Family Mass on the Feast day of St Joseph saw all staff and members of our community gathered in the hall for Mass with Fr John. It was good to welcome him back after his recovery from surgery.

In preparation for Easter, students have been finishing the day with reflections and Stations of the Cross provided by the Youth Ministry team in the Hexham and Newcastle Diocese. They have participated in an online service and a live stream service of reconciliation led by Fr Sean, with the opportunity for confession afterwards.

Early Closure

Important

Please read the email shared via EduLink on Wednesday, 27th March, with guidance on how to find the parental consent section on EduLink both for the App and the online version.

We ask parents to ensure your preference has been selected by Monday, 8th April.

Further to the early closure of school last month due to snow, we have taken feedback from both our staff and parental emails that we received. We have updated our Early Closure Consent options as follows.

New Early Closure Consent Options:

The following options are now available to select from on EduLink. Please only select ONE option. Multiple selections will not be accepted as they cause confusion and could delay the release of your child. Please consider mirroring your selection for each sibling in school.

Wait to be collected from reception (please collect within 30 minutes of the notification)

Your child will remain in their form room until you arrive in to reception to collect them.

Leave site and make their own way home (this includes walking home, going to someone else's house, using public transport, being collected by car on the main road)

Please do not drive on to the school site as we cannot guarantee your safety in poor weather conditions. School parking permit guidance still applies.

Wait for school bus/make their own way home (if the school bus is cancelled/delayed my child can make their own way home)

We will advise parents/carers of the expected bus arrival time when we message you to inform you about the closure.

If the bus is cancelled or the bus is delayed to a time after school needs to close, your child will be released to make their own way home. We will send a message to parents/carers to inform you if this happens.

'Make their own way home' for this option includes the same examples as above.

Wait for school bus/wait to be collected (if the school bus is cancelled/delayed my child must wait to be collected – please collect within 30 minutes of the notification)

We will advise parents/carers of the expected bus arrival time when we message you to inform you about the closure.

If the bus is cancelled or the bus is delayed to a time after school needs to close, your child will wait to be collected. We will send a message to parents/carers to inform you if this happens. Please collect your child within 30 minutes of the notification.

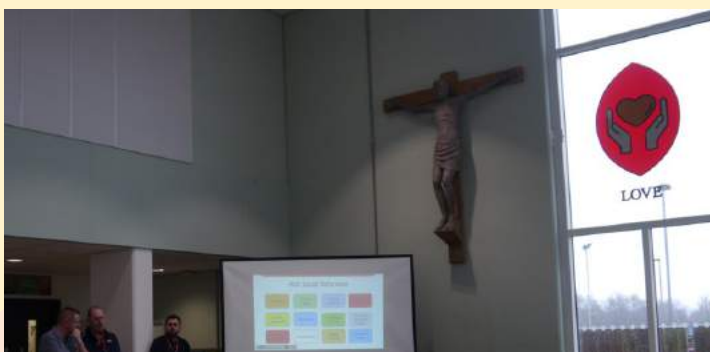
Key Stage 3

Modulo Music Trip

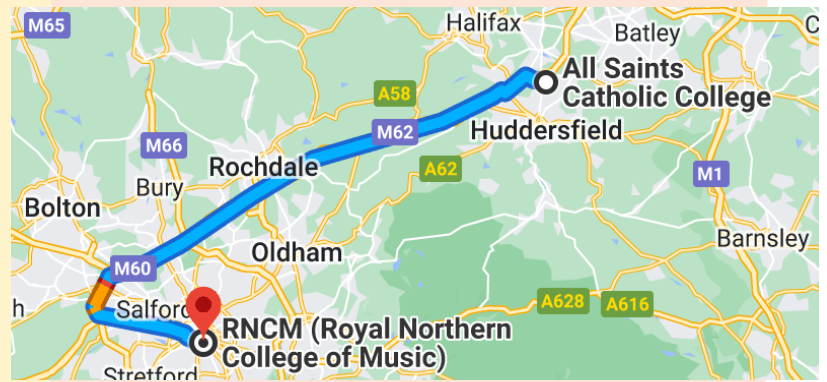
On Tuesday, 19th March, members of the All Saints band went to the Royal Northern College of Music to take part in the Orchestras for All Modulo Music Programme.

Any students that can play any instrument are welcome to come to the All Saints band who rehearse every Thursday after-school, and Friday during form time in the music room, G16.



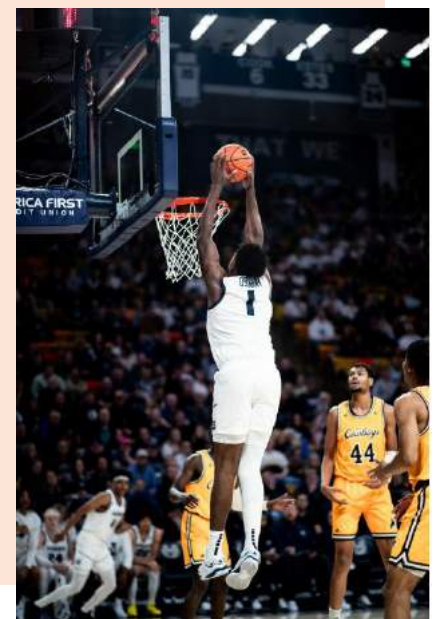
Former Student News

FFT collects daily attendance data from over 10,500 schools.

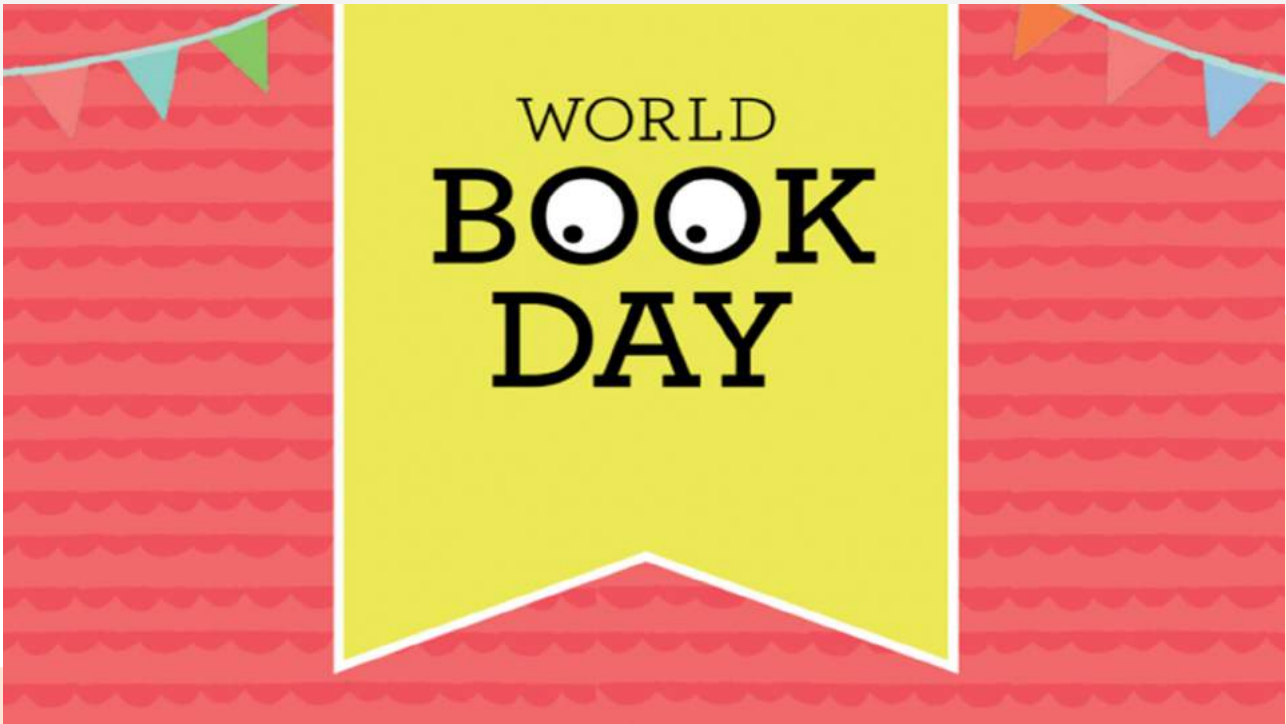
Awards are given to schools with attendance in the top 10% and top 25% of all FFT schools nationally.

To celebrate World Book Day, we enjoyed a shared story reading of Doris Lessing's *Through the Tunnel*.

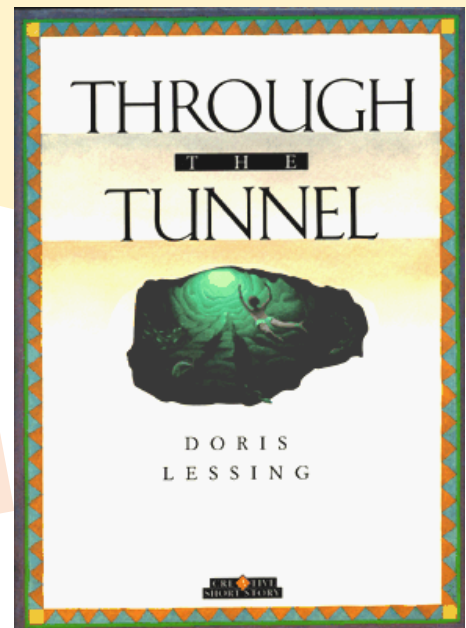
This short story explores the theme of growing up and the transition from childhood to adulthood. The story follows Jerry, a young English boy who is on holiday with his mother at a foreign beach.

Jerry becomes fascinated by a group of local boys who can swim through an underwater tunnel. He decides to challenge himself and prove his courage by attempting the same feat. He succeeds, but he does not tell his mother, feeling a new sense of independence and maturity.

Teachers read the story to their classes across each lesson of the day to build suspense for our students.

Before each reading, students were asked to recall what had happened in the last extract they had listened to. They were also asked what they thought would happen next, and why.

World Book Day tokens were given out to students in form time, giving them the opportunity to obtain a free book.

EduLink One Communication

A polite reminder of our preferred communication channel between parents/carers and the school. This system allows us to support you in monitoring your child's progress, updating us with contact and medical information, receiving communications from school, booking after-school activities, and most recently, booking appointments for parents' evenings.

The transition to EduLink One has been success although we still have a small number of parents/carers who are yet to activate their account. We encourage you to do this as soon as possible to ensure you are not missing out on important information and opportunities for your children.

EduLink One is free to access on any modern web enabled device, either via www.edulinkone.com on a web browser on PCs, laptops, tablets and mobile devices or, with the dedicated app on Android or iOS.

You are eligible to access EduLink One if you are a parent/carer with parental responsibility for a student at All Saints Catholic College. If you have more than one child at the school, you will only require one account. You will need the following information to log in:

Only urgent whole school messages will be sent by text, all other messages will be sent as push notifications through the app - these will appear as pop-ups on your device.

The only other service parents/carers will need to make use of is ParentPay for paying for school lunches, trips and purchasing other items such as ties, calculators and revision materials.

Students can now access this system with their own school log in details, but cannot use this to secure their place for after-school clubs and events. This must be done by a parent/carer using their own log in details.

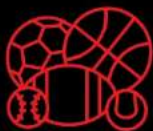
