Chaplaincy Update

We have been to Revelation and the new dates have been published ready for next year.

The staff Chaplaincy group have met to start planning staff faith development opportunities and wellbeing.

Adoration was well attended at the start of the half term and once again was a beautiful, prayer filled experience for students and staff. Next academic year, Fr John will be joining us to live stream the benediction at the end so that the whole school has an opportunity to pray before the Blessed Sacrament.

Our student Chaplaincy groups have continued to meet and we will be launching the new intake with Year 7 in September, and look forward to continuing our work in love and service for the school and wider community.

Cian in Year 10 has been accepted into 'The Twelve', a group of young people from across the Diocese who take on various projects at the request of the Bishop. They provide the young people's viewpoint of the church and its mission in talks with the Bishop. It is a great honour for Cian to work closely with the Bishop and to be active at a Diocesan level.

His appointment is very much in recognition of his contributions to his own Parish and to the Catholic life of our school.



Students and staff from All Saints joined many other schools in the Diocese in presenting our Good Shepherd fundraising to the Bishop as part of a special service in Leeds Cathedral. The students had the honour of being selected because of their numerous contributions to the Catholic life of the school, willing to volunteer to help in services and Masses on a regular basis, or for being part of the SVP group. They carried the school banner in the procession at the start of the service and spoke to the Bishop as they donated our contribution. The money raised supports the valuable and wide-ranging help that Catholic Care provides to many people within the Diocese.

On the 4th of July, all our preparations for the Lourdes Pilgrimage came to fruition as we embarked on the epic coach journey to the south of France. We were blessed with a great group of students who were willing to fully involve themselves in every aspect of the pilgrimage; pushing wheelchairs, chatting with the assisted pilgrims, carrying banners and candles, singing and praying. Fr John added much to our spiritual journey as did the Franciscan Sisters and Brothers who accompanied us. We met familiar faces from the parish and the All Saints community as well as pilgrims we had met before. Daniel and Cian were thanked by the Bishop for their altar serving throughout the week. We lit a candle and left it at the domain to hold our prayers for our community. Our prayer petitions from school and some of the parishes of the students were delivered to the grotto and were offered in the Mass there. Our ministry students who served and read have been actively involved in Chaplaincy since Year 7, and this was their final opportunity to contribute to a school Mass.


We would like to thank Jacob, Ben, Gayle and Fintan for all their service to Chaplaincy throughout their time at All Saints and their example as faith leaders.

We ended the Mass in song with a hearty rendition of 'Oh When the Saints' thanks to Mrs Sidwell and the school band.







Cost of Living Voucher

Kirklees has funded £60 cost of living vouchers for families of children in receipt of means-tested Free School Meals.

The voucher was issued via Wonde, our preferred voucher supplier on Friday, 19th July.

It is important to note this is not a 'Free School Meals payment', it is financial support on a broader scale, reflecting the current financial challenges being faced.

Kirklees Council offers a range of support to anyone who is struggling, not just children.

We would like to remind families that Kirklees Local Welfare Provision (LWP) scheme helps vulnerable people in short-term crisis with food and essential items.

Entitlement for help is based on a person or family's circumstances at the time, and is discretionary.

Transport Update

Important Information - C78 Halifax School Bus

Please be aware that, starting from September 2024, First Bus will no longer issue travel passes for students attending our school. This decision has been made by the bus company due to repeated violations of their terms and conditions by students who have been using other forms of bus passes for this dedicated C78 school route.

Despite numerous reminders to parents regarding the use of First Bus travel passes for All Saints, students have continued to board the bus with MetroCards.

As a result, from September 2024 onwards, if your child wishes to use the C78 Halifax First Bus Service, the only available fare will be a single fare costing £2 each way. Please ensure your child has the correct change for each journey.

For students wishing to continue to use a MetroCard, they will need to travel on the public service 548/549 from Halifax to Brighouse and transfer to the X63 bus. Please note, this is not a dedicated school bus service and you will have to refer to Metro for the dedicated timetables and routes.

School Meal Prices

We have been advised by Kirklees that, from September 2024, the price of a school meal will be £2.90.

This is a set price across all maintained high schools in Kirklees where food is supplied by the local authority.

The £2.90 meal deal includes a hot meal and either a hot pudding with custard or a home bake (biscuit/flapjack/cake/muffin).

Please be aware that a drink (small bottle of water) is no longer included in the meal deal, and so we recommend that students bring a refillable water bottle with them to school each day.

A new 4-week menu will be available after the holidays, details will be available on our website from September.

Maths Roundup



It has been a successful year in maths.

In the UKMT (Mathematics Trust) challenges, our students have been awarded as follows:

Please read the email shared via EduLink on Wednesday, 27th March, with guidance on how to find the parental consent section on EduLink both for the App and the online version.

We ask parents to ensure your preference has been selected by Monday, 2nd September

Further to the early closure of school due to snow earlier this year, we took feedback from both our staff and parental emails that we received. We have updated our Early Closure Consent options as follows.

New Early Closure Consent Options:

The following options are now available to select from on EduLink. <u>Please only select ONE option</u>. Multiple selections will not be accepted as they cause confusion and could delay the release of your child. Please consider mirroring your selection for each sibling in school.

Wait to be collected from reception (please collect within 30 minutes of the notification)

Your child will remain in their form room until you arrive in to reception to collect them.

Leave site and make their own way home (this includes walking home, going to someone else's house, using public transport, being collected by car on the main road)

Please do not drive on to the school site as we cannot guarantee your safety in poor weather conditions. School parking permit guidance still applies.

Wait for school bus/make their own way home (if the school bus is cancelled/delayed my child can make their own way home)

We will advise parents/carers of the expected bus arrival time when we message you to inform you about the closure.

If the bus is cancelled or the bus is delayed to a time after school needs to close, your child will be released to make their own way home. We will send a message to parents/carers to inform you if this happens.

'Make their own way home' for this option includes the same examples as above.

Wait for school bus/wait to be collected (if the school bus is cancelled/delayed my child must wait to be collected – please collect within 30 minutes of the notification)

We will advise parents/carers of the expected bus arrival time when we message you to inform you about the closure.

If the bus is cancelled or the bus is delayed to a time after school needs to close, your child will wait to be collected. We will send a message to parents/carers to inform you if this happens. Please collect your child within 30 minutes of the notification.

EduLink One Communication

A polite reminder of our preferred communication channel between parents/carers and the school. This system allows us to support you in monitoring your child's progress, updating us with contact and medical information, receiving communications from school, booking after-school activities, and most recently, booking appointments for parents' evenings.

The transition to EduLink One has been success although we still have a small number of parents/carers who are yet to activate their account. We encourage you to do this as soon as possible to ensure you are not missing out on important information and opportunities for your children.

Edulink One is free to access on any modern web enabled device, either via www.edulinkone.com on a web browser on PCs, laptops, tablets and mobile devices or, with the dedicated app on Android or iOS.

You are eligible to access EduLink One if you are a parent/carer with parental responsibility for a student at All Saints Catholic College. If you have more than one child at the school, you will only require one account. You will need the following information to log in:

You can access your child's details, timetable, attendance, behaviour, achievement points, book your parent evening appointments and secure your child's after-school club place(s). All messages, notifications and emails are now sent to parents/carers through EduLink. Please ensure you turn on notifications for the app to ensure you do not miss any messages. Only urgent whole school messages will be sent by text, all other messages will be sent as push notifications through the app - these will appear as pop-ups on your device.

The only other service parents/carers will need to make use of is ParentPay for paying for school lunches, trips and purchasing other items such as ties, calculators and revision materials.

Students can now access this system with their own school log in details, but cannot use this to secure their place for after-school clubs and events. This must be done by a parent/carer using their own log in details.

MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

What is Box to Beat It?

Box to Beat It is a 12-week programme that uses non-contact boxing and mentoring to improve young people's well-being. The programme has been designed together with young people and in partnership with mental health charity Mind.

Throughout the programme, young people will work through a series of activities that give them the tools to support their mental health.

Who is Box to Beat It for?

Box to Beat It is aimed at young people aged 10 - 16 years old who are experiencing mild to moderate mental health problems. It is also suitable as a preventative measure to educate young people on their wellbeing. Young people must be able to work in small groups.

Who are the coaches?

All coaches are England Boxing qualified coaches with DBS, Safeguarding and First Aid qualifications. Additionally, coaches are Mental Health First Aid trained and experienced in supporting young people who are experiencing mental health problems.

How can I refer a young person?

Young people can be referred by a Health Practitioner, Link Worker, Community
