




































Lourdes 2025

Shoes - please be aware, we have updated our school shoe policy as follows:

Wear plain black, smart leather school-type shoes. Sensible shoes remain essential for the safety of students and slip on 'ballet-style' or 'holiday' footwear is not appropriate in College. Fashion shoes, pumps, boots, crocs, trainers or sport-branded shoes <u>are not acceptable</u>. Any sport-branded footwear will not be accepted.

School Meals

From September 2025, the price of a school lunch will be £3 per day. If you feel your circumstances have changed and you wish to check your eligibility for free school meal (FSM) provision, please contact Kirklees via Kirklees - Free School Meals.

National Breakfast Programme

All students can access a free toasted bagel before school.

Please remind your child that these are available from the glass canopy on the dining room yard BEFORE school. This offer is only available at this time and payment for any additional purchases at breaktime would be required.

Catering staff will continue to use the same spread on the bagels that they use in all their recipes during break and lunchtimes.



Uniform Exchange is a community project set up to make sure every child in Kirklees has access to free school uniform if they need it.


Unfortunately, countless tonnes of uniform are being thrown into landfill in Kirklees every year.

GRIT Course - Part 1

Some of our Key Stage 3 students are attending a G.R.I.T. (Gaining Resilience In Teamwork) course with West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service at Huddersfield Fire Station.

This programme encourages young people to work together to achieve, and the high energy course uses practical challenges to develop and stretch students' ability to work together.

Students are involved with classroom-based exercises and activities which take place outside. The students have been fabulous and have really got stuck in with the activities offered.

Students have learned how to take the ladder off a fire engine, carry it and position it safely, as well as climb up it and put a leg lock in place. They have also used the ladder to get into a training tower.

Once inside the tower the floors are reached by metal ladders, and all students continued up these ladders to the top.

There was some nervousness and doubts from a few students - one of which was adamant that they weren't going to the top of the first ladder but absolutely smashed it by going all the way to the top and back down again after a bit of reassurance was given.

All students supported each other with the activities and were all supported by PC Sally Baines who was also present.



GRIT Course - Part 2

During this session on the G.R.I.T. course, the classroom-based session was on RTCs and the Fatal 5. Students watched a road safety video which showed the importance of wearing a seat belt in the car.


Outside activities included using the cutting equipment (aka The Jaws of Life) which were tested on some old car doors - this was apparently a lot harder than it looked. Support was needed for the smaller members of the group to hold it, but everyone pitched in.

The group were involved in a scenario where they had to take the but between two doors off and take a casualty out of the car. The students took it in turns to do various roles - the casualty, person sat next to them comforting them and telling them what was going on, someone holding the casualty's neck straight, holding equipment to shield the casualty's face, and cutting off the bit of the car.

They then brought the casualty out on a spinal board and took them away to safety.

Some really great work from the group with some notable efforts from the group who showed great skills with the cutting equipment, as team leaders, acting as casualties and comforting the casualties. One student in particular was fabulous at all the practical elements involved.

The group have become really comfortable with what they are doing on the course and as part of the expectations that are discussed each week, and they are all aware of the importance of communication to support the activities that they are involved in.



Spanish

Year 8 students have been exploring Spanish surrealistic art and have recently created their own version of the art work inspired by Joan Miró.

The students presented the paintings in front of their peers and talked in Spanish about various shapes and colours they used.





Science - Big Bang

The science department have had another successful trip to the Big Bang science festival at the Birmingham NEC on 19th June.


This is the United Kingdom's largest celebration of STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) for young people, and is one of the largest youth events in the UK.

It was fantastic to hear our wonderful Year 8s singing on the coach as we headed down, full of enthusiasm and excitement for what was to come.

Once there, they dived straight in and engaged in over 70 hands-on activities brought to them by many universities and companies, including Rolls Royce, National Grid, Warwick University and Specsavers. They also chatted to 'real life' scientists and engineers about what they do and how they get inspired.

It was fantastic to see our students joining in and getting on stage. A member of the Big Bang team let us know how our students stood out with their 'fantastic scientific knowledge and in depth questioning' which made us proud - well done Year 8!

We are already looking forward to Big Bang 2026!

Parent Survey Feedback

Thank you to all parents/carers who have participated in this year's various surveys.

We review all suggestions to help us improve and evolve our practices, where possible.

Please find a summary of changes we are making, based on your feedback, below.

Parents Evening Surveys (all year groups across the academic year)

A number of concerns were raised about the current appointment structure. To support with your concerns moving forward, teachers will call out the names of parents in order of appointments to ensure we can stick to the schedule as far as possible.

Some questions were also asked about what to do when appointments could not be made - either because there were none available or because the member of staff was absent. We invite all parents to request either a phone call or an email to update you on your child's progress from their class teacher if you have been unable to book an appointment, or a booked appointment is cancelled due to teacher absence.

Parent Survey May 2025

We have updated our policy to ensure the requirements around school shoes are clearer. More information can be found on page 6 of this newsletter.

We share data three times a year to update you on your child's academic and pastoral experience, if any parent would like additional feedback, you are warmly invited to contact the relevant class teachers, learning tutor or achievement coordinator.

We have reviewed our homework policy for September 2025, following queries from parents about how to find out what homework their child has been set and what they can do to support their child to complete this. Homework is always connected to the curriculum, the curriculum map for each subject (outlining what is taught and when) is available on the school website in the curriculum area.





EduLink One Communication

A polite reminder of our preferred communication channel between parents/carers and the school. This system allows us to support you in monitoring your child's progress, updating us with contact and medical information, receiving communications from school, booking after-school activities, and most recently, booking appointments for parents' evenings.

The transition to EduLink One has been success although we still have a small number of parents/carers who are yet to activate their account. We encourage you to do this as soon as possible to ensure you are not missing out on important information and opportunities for your children.

Edulink One is free to access on any modern web enabled device, either via www.edulinkone.com on a web browser on PCs, laptops, tablets and mobile devices or, with the dedicated app on Android or iOS.

You are eligible to access EduLink One if you are a parent/carer with parental responsibility for a student at All Saints Catholic College. If you have more than one child at the school, you will only require one account. You will need the following information to log in:

Username	You will receive an email with your username details.
Password	You can change your password once you have logged in.

You can access your child's details, timetable, attendance, behaviour, achievement points, book your parent evening appointments and secure your child's after-school club place(s). All messages, notifications and emails are now sent to parents/carers through EduLink. Please ensure you turn on notifications for the app to ensure you do not miss any messages. Only urgent whole school messages will be sent by text, all other messages will be sent as push notifications through the app - these will appear as pop-ups on your device.

The only other service parents/carers will need to make use of is ParentPay for paying for school lunches, trips and purchasing other items such as ties, calculators and revision materials.

Students can now access this system with their own school log in details, but cannot use this to secure their place for after-school clubs and events. This must be done by a parent/carer using their own log in details.
