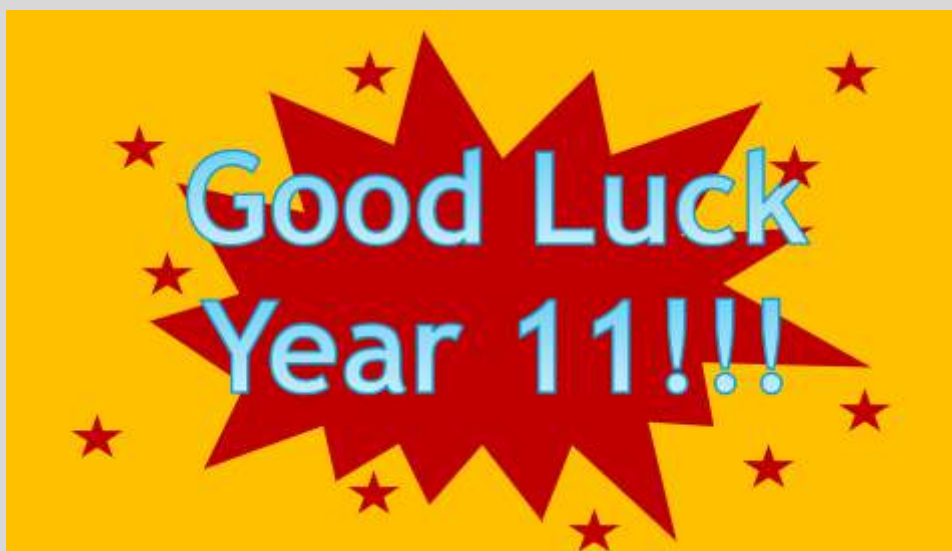
Shakespeare Day and National Numeracy Day have been recognised and marked appropriately.

Chaplaincy Update

Students have continued to be involved in the Catholic life of the school in their participation in the prayer life through morning prayers and Mass.

Our most recent Mass, for the Feast of the Ascension, was live streamed to allow as many people to attend as possible during the exam season. The Lourdes students were in the Chapel with the Mass broadcast into classrooms around school. Fr John offered the prayer for spiritual communion for those not in the Chapel.

The environmental group, led by Miss Croke, volunteered to plan and deliver collective worship for Earth Day, drawing inspiration from Pope Francis' letter on care for our common home. They also linked their witness to Catholic social principles of stewardship and responsibility.

We have recently attended the Good Shepherd Mass at the Cathedral, and we are preparing for Adoration in the Chapel and the Year 11 Leavers Mass.

The music department are very busy practicing with the band and choir the hymns and music for our Masses.

Chaplaincy Training

More recently, Mrs Rhys-Hill also attended the training for catechists presented by the Dominican Sisters of St Joseph on how to accompany people on their faith formation journey through the three-part model of Witness, Teaching and Accompaniment.

Careers

To continue to provide students with **outstanding careers guidance** and tailored support when choosing their next step after school, we are using Unifrog, an award-winning, online destinations platform. All students in Years 7, 8, 9, and 10 now have access to this platform.

What is Unifrog?

Unifrog is designed to support students in **making informed decisions about their futures**, with a range of tools that are suitable for all year groups. Each student has their own account that provides a range of information related to their interests and aspirations.

Key features of the platform for students include:

- Psychometric testing quizzes
- Career and subject exploration
- Webinars and interactive short courses
- Self-reflection and portfolio building tools
- Search tools for live apprenticeship and employer opportunities, and university courses
- Application and essay-building tools

Students at Unifrog schools can log in from any computer, tablet, or smartphone.

We encourage you to use the platform with your child so you can support them through the process of deciding on their next steps.

You can create your own parent account where you'll be able to see what your child is doing on Unifrog, including any interactions tagged against their name and any upcoming events we've logged for them. You'll also be able to use all the same tools your child can to support them on their Unifrog journey.

To recognise the highest performers in the challenge, UKMT award the top-scoring 50% of participants bronze, silver and gold certificates in the ratio 3:2:1.

Students that are 'Best in Year' or 'Best in School' will also receive a badge to denote this on their certificates.

Students not amongst the high scorers will receive a Certificate of Participation.

In addition, UKMT invite around 1,200 of the very highest performers to take part in the [Junior Olympiad](#) and over 10,000 to take part in the [Junior Kangaroo](#).

The 2026 award thresholds were:

Gold 75+, Silver 59+, Bronze 47+, Junior Kangaroo 80+ (UK only), Junior Mathematical Olympiad 112+

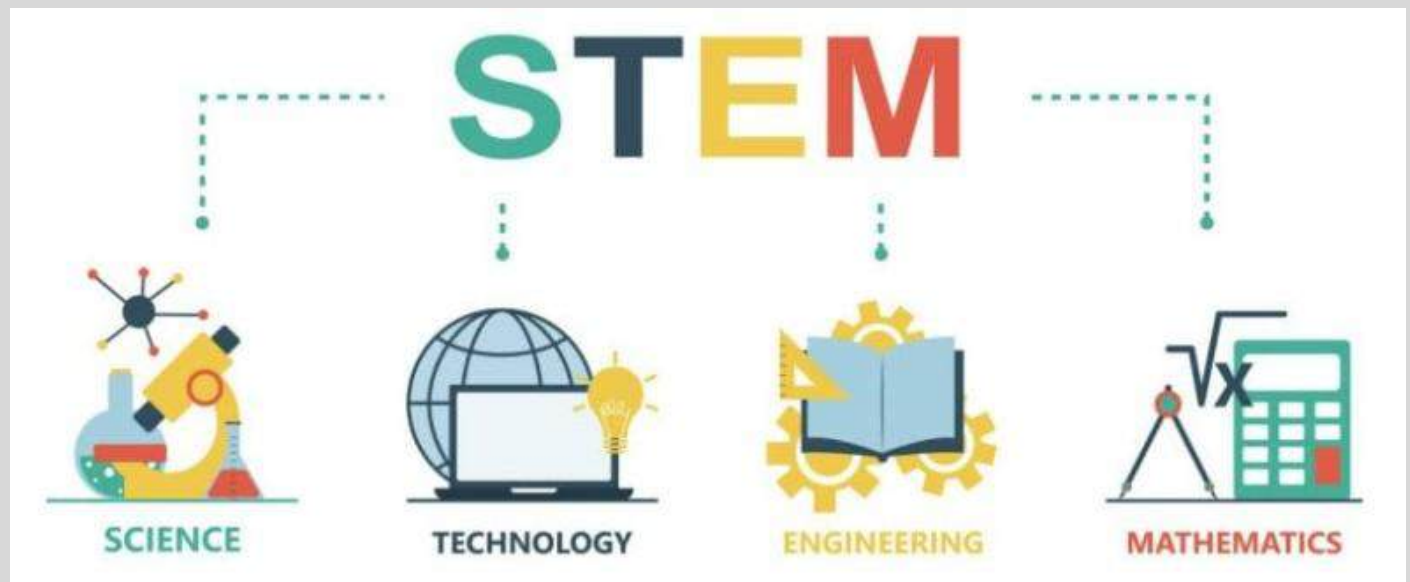
Science Update

EduLink

A polite reminder of our preferred communication channel between parents/carers and the school. This system allows us to support you in monitoring your child's progress, updating us with contact and medical information, receiving communications from school, booking after-school activities and appointments for parents' evenings.

We still have a small number of parents/carers who are yet to activate their account. We encourage you to do this as soon as possible to ensure you are not missing out on important information and opportunities for your children.

EduLink One is free to access on any modern web-enabled device, either via www.edulinkone.com on a web browser on PCs, laptops, tablets and mobile devices or, with the dedicated app on Android or iOS.

You are eligible to access EduLink One if you are a parent/carer with parental responsibility for a student at All Saints Catholic College. If you have more than one child at the school, you will only require one account. You will need the following information to log in:

School ID	You can either use ASCC or HD22JT
Username	You will receive an email with your username details.
Password	You can change your password once you have logged in.

Login details are sent to the email address you have already provided to school from edulink@aschc.com. Please check your junk mail if you have not received this and remember to let us know if you have updated your email address.

You can access your **child's details, timetable, attendance, behaviour, praise points, book your parent evening appointments and secure your child's after-school club place(s)**.

All messages, notifications and emails are sent to parents/carers through EduLink. Please ensure you turn on notifications for the app to ensure you do not miss any messages. Only urgent whole school messages will be sent by text; all other messages will be sent as push notifications through the app - these will appear as pop-ups on your device.

The only other service parents/carers will need to make use of is ParentPay for paying for school lunches, trips and purchasing other items such as ties, calculators and revision materials.

Students can now access this system with their own school log in details but cannot use this to secure their place for after-school clubs and events. This must be done by a parent/carer using their own log in details. A reminder that students will not be able to stay for after-school activities and events if they have not been signed up by a parent/carer on EduLink.
