Lourdes 2026

It was a very warm pilgrimage this year, with temperatures in the high 30s, but this didn't stop us from making the most of our time in Lourdes. With sun hats, sun cream and lots of water, we made sure that we were well hydrated and protected from the sun.

Our assisted pilgrims included some returners and familiar faces from the local parishes. It was a real pleasure to see the students engaging with the pilgrims and learning all about each other. We participated in a very large torchlight procession with so many participants that we didn't actually start processing until we had finished the rosary.

Joseph had the honour of carrying a candle at the front of the procession as our school representative. The prayer petitions we took with us were carried in this procession. Highlights of the visit were a trip to Gavarnie in the mountains, and Mr Smith's light photography. We also saw a couple of the Tour de France Team trucks in town as the Tour passed close by. Free School Meals

A £50 Free School Meal voucher was sent via email to eligible families on Friday, 17th July.

Please be aware that Kirklees Council has confirmed that this will be the last voucher payment, and no future vouchers will be provided.

A reminder also that Free School Meals will be changing from September 2026.

If your child is currently eligible but you did not complete the consent form shared with you last month, to check eligibility, you will need to reapply to the local authority for entitlement from September.

Parent Survey

Parent Survey Response - May 2026

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete our Parent Survey. We greatly appreciate your honest feedback. It is encouraging to see that many families value the care, commitment and dedication of our staff, while the survey has also highlighted areas where we know we need to continue improving. Your feedback helps shape our priorities and ensures we continue to develop the best possible experience for our students and families.

Quality of Education

Many parents spoke positively about the quality of teaching, the commitment of our staff and the progress their children are making. We are grateful for the many comments recognising individual teachers and support staff who have made a positive difference to students' experiences.

Some parents also highlighted concerns about consistency in teaching, staffing changes in some subjects and the impact of staff absence.

We continue to work hard to recruit and retain high-quality staff, minimise disruption wherever possible and ensure departments have appropriate support when staffing changes occur. We will also continue to review curriculum planning and intervention programmes to maximise learning opportunities for all students.

Behaviour and Positive Discipline

Behaviour and the Positive Discipline Policy generated the widest range of views. Many parents recognise that high expectations help create a calm and purposeful learning environment, while others expressed concerns about how aspects of the policy are experienced by individual children.

Over the past two years we have continued to refine our approach in response to feedback from students, parents and staff. Our aim remains to provide a safe, respectful and disruption-free environment where every child can learn successfully.

We also recognise that there are occasions where individual students require reasonable adjustments because of additional needs or specific circumstances. These adjustments are carefully considered and are made to support the needs of the child while maintaining high expectations for all.

We will continue to review our behaviour systems regularly and welcome constructive feedback that helps us improve further.

SEND and Individual Support

A number of parents praised the support their children have received, particularly from individual staff members. However, several families shared concerns about SEND provision, communication and understanding of individual needs.

We recognise that navigating SEND processes can be complex and, at times, frustrating for families.

We remain committed to working collaboratively with parents, external agencies and students to ensure appropriate support is in place.

We will continue to review our communication with families regarding SEND provision and ensure parents understand both the support available within school and the processes that involve external agencies.

Communication with Parents

Several parents highlighted positive relationships with staff, while others felt communication could be clearer, more timely or more personalised.

Improving communication remains one of our priorities. We will continue to:

- Review how and when information is shared.
- Ensure communications are as clear and targeted as possible.
- Continue improving the use of EduLink so messages are personalised where appropriate.
- Encourage parents to contact us whenever they need clarification or support.

Student Wellbeing

Many parents recognised the caring ethos of the school and the positive relationships that exist between students and staff. Some families also highlighted the need for additional emotional wellbeing support, particularly around anxiety, SEND and examination preparation.

Student wellbeing remains central to our work. We will continue to develop our pastoral support, work alongside external agencies where appropriate and review the support available during key transition and examination periods.

Curriculum and Enrichment

Some parents commented on homework, revision opportunities, library access and wider learning experiences.

We will continue to review:

- The communication of homework expectations.
- Access to revision and intervention opportunities across subjects.
- Library provision and study facilities, where staffing allows.
- The balance between curriculum time, enrichment and whole-school activities.

Working Together

A number of parents commented that they did not always feel heard when raising concerns.

We are committed to ensuring all concerns are listened to respectfully and responded to through our published procedures.

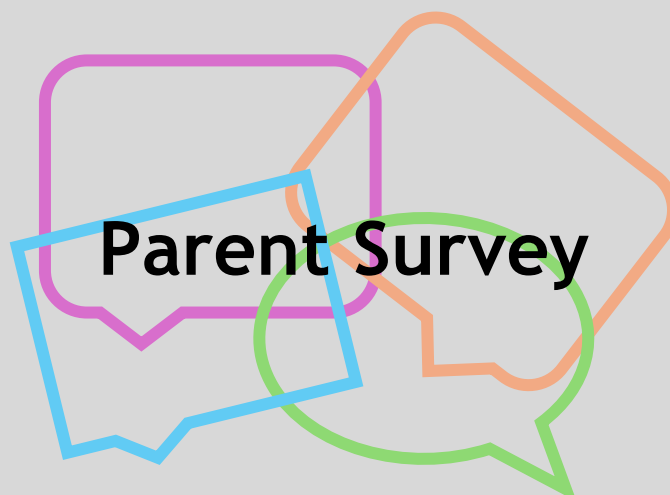
While we may not always reach the same conclusions, we believe that open, respectful dialogue is essential in building positive relationships between home and school.

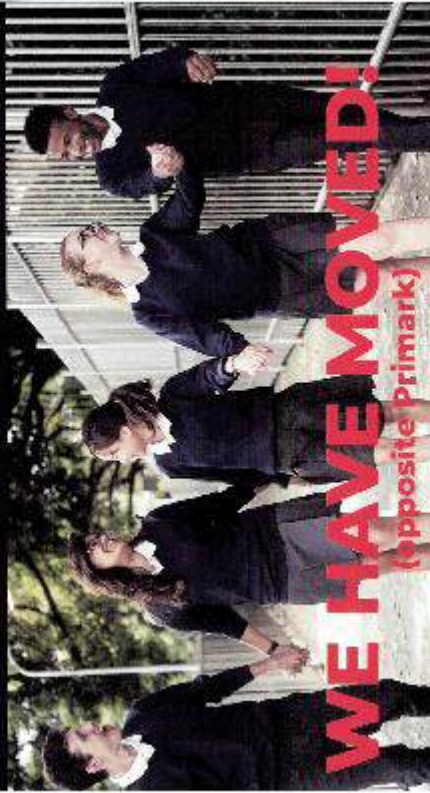

Anti-Bullying

Following on from the Working Together to Keep our Children Safe letter sent to parents this half term, we have been continuing our work on our anti-bullying and safety campaign.

Information has been given to students in anti-bullying and respect assemblies encouraging them to break the silence and report bullying so that it can be dealt with and stopped, and support provided to them.

An explanation of what bullying is, and what forms that can take was given to help students understand and identify the behaviours that are unacceptable and distressing to others.

The term 'banter' being used as an excuse to downplay bullying was also explained and made clear that this was unacceptable, along with information that discriminating against someone who comes under any of the 9 protected characteristics of the Equality Act 2010, is classed as a hate crime.

Students were made aware of how to report concerns - in person (to any adult in school, to their parent/carer), in writing (fill out a form and place it in the post box on the ground floor - they can add their name or leave it anonymous), electronically (scan the QR code or use the link on our website to fill out a form - they can add their name or leave it anonymous).

Details of what actions will be taken by staff were explained to students. This includes an investigation, gathering statements, reviewing CCTV if applicable, updating those involved - including parents, and following up with the student to ensure the bullying has stopped.

We have also met with various groups of students across the school to obtain student voice on the subject and included their feedback to strengthen and support our next steps.

A collection of posters is displayed around the school to remind students of what bullying is and how to report it. These were approved by our Student Council representatives. Copies can be seen over the next couple of pages.

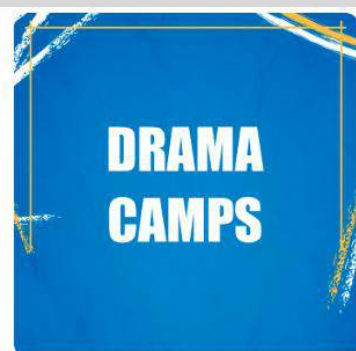

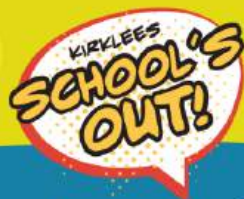

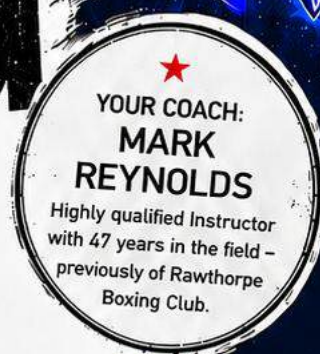

We still have a number of parents/carers who are yet to activate their account. We encourage you to do this as soon as possible to ensure you are not missing out on important information and opportunities for your children.

EduLink One is free to access on any modern web-enabled device, either via www.edulinkone.com on a web browser on PCs, laptops, tablets and mobile devices or, with the dedicated app on Android or iOS.

You are eligible to access EduLink One if you are a parent/carer with parental responsibility for a student at All Saints Catholic College. If you have more than one child at the school, you will only require one account. You will need the following information to log in:

School ID	You can either use ASCC or HD22JT
Username	You will receive an email with your username details.
Password	You can change your password once you have logged in.

Login details are sent to the email address you have already provided to school from edulink@aschc.com. Please check your junk mail if you have not received this and remember to let us know if you have updated your email address.

You can access your child's details, timetable, attendance, behaviour, praise points, book your parent evening appointments and secure your child's after-school club place(s).

All messages, notifications and emails are sent to parents/carers through EduLink. Please ensure you turn on notifications for the app to ensure you do not miss any messages. Only urgent whole school messages will be sent by text; all other messages will be sent as push notifications through the app - these will appear as pop-ups on your device.

The only other service parents/carers will need to make use of is ParentPay for paying for school lunches, trips and purchasing other items such as ties, calculators and revision materials.

Students can now access EduLink with their own school log in details but cannot use this to secure their place for after-school clubs and events. This must be done by a parent/carer using their own log in details. A reminder that students will not be able to stay for after-school activities and events if they have not been signed up by a parent/carer on EduLink.
